A therapy horse must be very quiet and patient with the riders. Because our riders are so vulnerable, we must be very selective in choosing our horses. The first step in having your horse evaluated is to fill out the attached information sheet and email it back to us at **openinggaitssociety@gmail.com**. After the information is reviewed by our equine team you will be contacted and if your horse looks like a good fit for our program we will schedule an on-site evaluation. If, after the initial evaluation, your horse looks like it would make a good therapy horse arrangements will be made to transport him/her to Bar None Ranches, Foothills MD, AB for a 30 day trial period.
